Bring This Catalog to the Auction!

Before auction night, browse the catalog and plan your bidding. Make notes in it ahead of time. Bring it with you to the auction. You'll want it that night to keep track of items and your bids on them.

You must register (for free) before the auction starts. The registrar will keep a record of your name and **bidding number** to keep track of your purchases throughout the night. Spouses/partners can share a number or each can have a unique number.

Live Auction

The live auction will be a fun, fast and furious way to bid on items. Sean, our auctioneer, will describe items while his assistants show them to the crowd. Hold up your number and holler out your bid. Sean's helpers will encourage bidding and keep track of the highest bids.

Silent Auction

Bidding in the silent auction takes place on tables. Bid sheets allow you to bid, monitor, and re-bid on interesting items. **Use your bidding number—not your name!** Each item will be assigned the same number found in this catalog. If someone outbids you, you are encouraged to go back and increase your bid. The silent auction will close table by table, at rolling intervals, depending on the color of the table cover and balloon. Sean will make clear announcements of closing times for each table.
