What Is a Developmental Minister?

Now that we have a Developmental Minister hired for the coming years, some members of the congregation are asking, "What is a Developmental Minister anyway? And how is that different from a regular minister?"

For starters, a Developmental Minister (DM) is hired by the Board of Trustees instead of being "called" by a vote of the congregation. And unlike an interim minister, the DM is hired for more than a one-year contract: Rev. Joel will be signing a five-year contract, which is renewable.

Furthermore, some of the priorities for the DM are working on developmental goals that the

congregation has identified as necessary to strengthen and enhance the church and community. In 2021–2022, the Board of Trustees and the congregation together came up with five developmental goals that we wanted to work on with a DM. These goals are:

- 1: Establish a congregational culture rooted in trust and offering mutual respect and encouragement.
- 2: Implement improvements to our Governance and Leadership models, evaluating and optimizing our use of both professional staff and volunteer roles.
- 3: Create a coordinated social justice advocacy to both invigorate members and increase UUCM presence in the outside community.

Registration

If you created a bidder account in a previous year, your account is still available. **Try logging in ahead of time to make sure you remember the password!** If you are new this year, register for a bidder account online at: charityauction.bid/UUCMauction. You will not be able to bid without an account. (If you do not have computer access or are unable to place online bids, contact Denise Ewing and we can help you make bids via proxy.)

Catalog & Bidding

You can both look at the catalog and make your bids at charityauction.bid/UUCMauction!

Bidding works a lot like eBay. If you are interested in an item, you place a bid through your account. To make it super easy, you can set a maximum price you're willing to pay and it will automatically increase your bids for you! Otherwise, you will receive an email when you are outbid.

The *Buy It Now* feature will be active! If you love an offering and don't want to compete in the bidding process, just "Buy It Now" and it is yours! We have had a lot of hot items that were gone in mere minutes! So don't miss out - *Buy It Now*!

Check Out

When the auction is over, you will receive an email with the total amount that you owe and the items that you won. If you entered your credit card during the registration process, it will be super easy to check out. You will also be able to pay via PayPal or check.

Sunday, May 7-A Celebration Meal!

Join us for a meal after service on Sunday, May 7. A benefit of coming to church is that several items will be available for pick-up. How convenient! If your item is listed as being available on Sunday, May 7 but is not picked up - you will need to get to the church ASAP to collect it. Congregational Meeting – Sunday, May 21, 12:30 pm

UUCM's annual business congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, May 21, 2023, at 12:30pm. This will be an in-person meeting held in the church sanctuary with the option to attend via Zoom.

To be eligible to vote, please ensure that you are a member in good standing according to the following passage from our bylaws: Our By-laws define voting membership as follows: Article III, Section 2. Persons who have been admitted to membership for at least thirty (30) days, who make a financial pledge to the church and make a good-faith effort to pay it, who donate their time and services, and who attend church services and activities are deemed to be voting members with all rights and privileges. Members who by reason of health have not been able to participate in church affairs and members who by reason of financial hardship have not been able to make a monetary contribution, are nonetheless viewed by the church as being members.

Please note that a contribution of record for the 365 days preceding this meeting must be received by the church office by 4:00 pm, Monday, May 15, to fulfill the financial contribution requirement.

- 2. Approval of the agenda and minutes from the October 2022 Congregational meeting
- 3. Presentation of the finances in 2022–23 and the proposed budget for 2023–24
- 4. Vote on acceptance of the 2023–24 budget
- 5. Update on replacement of the church's HVAC system
- 6. Nominations for officers of the Board in 2023-24
- 7. Election of officers of the Board in 2023-24
- 8. Adjournment

- 4: Develop deeper comprehension as individuals and as a congregation of religious histories and diversities in what we bring into our UU covenants.
- 5: Strengthen the physical plant of the church by creating plans to care for what we have and expand in ways that align with our UU values.

See my discussion of these goals in the August 2022 *Unigram* here.

The congregation will need to work with Rev. Joel to decide which of these goals are still relevant for us—it is, after all, two years since we came up with them, and things have perhaps changed. Furthermore, we need to work with Joel to decide what these goals really mean. #3 and #5 are pretty straightforward, but the others require some interpretation as to what the goal really *is*.

The developmental goals are only *some* of the priorities for the DM. In other ways, Rev. Joel is just like a settled minister. Along with the worship associates, he will lead worship on Sundays, giving a sermon or a homily three Sundays a month. With Rev. Julia and the pastoral associates he will provide pastoral care to the congregation. He will conduct weddings and memorial services. He will act as the leader for the other staff. He will work with the Board and with various committees to make sure that the church is running smoothly and that various tasks are done.

The next five years should be an exciting time of change and renewal for UUCM. We will have an excellent minister to travel with us into a future of new possibilities.
